Since the last newsletter we have been tackling a number of specific areas which will be key parts of the eventual plan.

Marple Town Centre

We are now meeting regularly with Stockport Council Officers and Councillors to discuss and steer work on Marple Town Centre – with a range of issues such as how it looks and feels, how it is laid out, traffic, movement of pedestrians and access to amenities and shops etc.

Goyt Mill

We realise how important this building is to our area with its current use for some vital small industries and businesses and its huge potential. Plus it has listed status and is an iconic landmark. We are actively looking at the possibilities with the Council and owners.

Housing

Meanwhile on Housing we would welcome any interested volunteers to join and supplement our working group. Housing is a very important part of the Plan so if you have ideas about what the Plan should say (or not say) about housing for the next 20 years, please join us to help get this right.

How will we consult?

We are still aiming to carry out electronic consultation. This won't exclude other methods of course, but it is more effective and efficient to spend some time looking at how we can do this well. There will be more about how we plan to do this in the July newsletter.
